quon. The Indians fired one Gun

which they left & ran. Two of them
were shot dead. & others wounded
as the blood plainly showed.
I have taken a refreshing bath
& put on clean clothes, shirt &
cravens. They will not remain ch
long.

Monday September 9th 1850
Mr S. & I worked in Co with two others
with our Cradle. we worked out our
lead & made only \$18. each.
The Company of twenty Miners who
came in on Sat. have commenced
work, & are dissatisfied with the

Saturday Sept 7th 1850

Four of us have been working our Cradle to-day in Co. On this side of the River. Worked very hard & washed 300 Pails full & made in all \$273. for each \$68. A good days work for a Cradle. This afternoon a party of twenty miners came in from Trinity piloted here by Johnson for \$50 each. A party of thirty more is near here. An Indian dog was shot near Camp today by Mr. Strong. A cloudy day with some thunder & a sprinkling of rain.

Sunday Sept 8th.

Mr. S is herding our Animals to-day & I have remained in Camp. A part of the Co. have worked a part of the day & others rode out some six miles to the Camp of the 30 who are coming in & whose Animals the Indians attempted to drive off this morning from their guard. The Indians fired one Gun which they left & ran. Two of them were shot dead & others wounded as the blood plainly showed.

I have taken a refreshing bath & put on clean clothes, shirts & drawers. They will not remain clean long.

Monday Sept 9th 1850

Mr. S. & I worked in Co. with two others with our Cradle, we worked out our lead & made only \$18 each

The Company of twenty miners who came in on Sat have commenced work, & are dissatisfied with the Diggings. Day cool & cloudy. An Indian seen on the top of a mountain near us watching our Camp. &c.

Beaver River Sept 10th 1850

Mr. S. & I have worked very hard all day crevicing & have only made \$20 in all. A large Co. of seventy miners came in from Trinity & the Springs & encamped near us There are now here 126 miners & some 200 Animals.

Yesterday the Indians stole three Animals from the above party at mid day. There were many tracks near Camp this morning.

Wednesday Sept 11th. 1850

Most of our old Co. went down the River a mile to a bar & worked our
