DESPERATE INDIANS QUIETED.

We recently alluded to Indian Tom, Flat Creek Bill, and two other desperate Indians having shot several horses on Me-tion Creek and uttered threats against the lives of several white men. Determined to break up this desperate gang, under Sheriff Wm. Jackson procured warrants for their arrest (Tom being under indictment for murder), and accompanied by several armed men, started for the Indian camp on Squaw Creek on Tuesday night. The party surrounded the camp at day-break on Wednesday morning and called upon Tom and his companions to surrender, or be shot. Tom started to run for the brush, when Jackson and Fred Hall fired at him, killing him almost instantly. Indian Bill refused to give himself up and Emanuel Marshal shot at him. The ball struck him in the side of the neck, penetrated to the bone, and glanced downward along his spine and came out at the small of his back, not killing him instantly. The other "bad Indians" were not in the camp, having left a few days previous.

Jackson is entitled to great credit for his prompt and efficient style of dealing with these savages who have long been the terror of the community.

HAS BOUGHT A FARM.

The Orville Record, the Democratic paper of Butte, in its issue of March 18th, says:

O. P. Fitzgerald, Superintendent of Public Schools, has purchased a ranch near Lakeport. So it is announced by an exchange, which, however, says nothing about the change of school books in connection with the purchase. The Sacred record is more complete in mentioning a somewhat earlier transaction, and says Judas "purchased a field with the reward of his iniquity." May the Democratic State Convention leave him to the enjoyment of his ranch.

The Lakeport paper says the Superintendent intends to retire to his ranch after he is re-elected and closes another term of office. We notice that D. Libby, one of the agents of the book swindle, has lately opened out a brand new book store on Montgomery Street, San Francisco.

This money goes out of the pockets of the people to swell the purses of knaves and book monopolists, and the children of the county will have to use a lot of books entirely out of date.

THIEVES.

A few nights ago burglars attempted to gain entrance to Simpson & Leiter's Store at Horsetown, but did not quite succeed in their designs. The attempt however shows that there is bold and desperate rascals around. They went to work on the wall of the store pointing on Main Street and picked a hole nearly through the wall when their progress was arrested by coming in contact with an iron bar imbedded in the brick and mortar. Before they could dig around this impediment, they evidently became alarmed, or found morning approaching, and concluded to leave. Had they got inside the store they could have helped themselves to about a hundred dollars in silver which the proprietors left in the drawer over night. They need not trouble themselves to come back after the coin, however—if they do, they will not find it, besides they might get hurt.

RETURNED.

Hon. J. N. Chappell, who recently visited San Francisco and also took a tour through Solano, Napa, and Sonoma, returned home a few days ago. He reports the crop prospects as very promising in Solano, Napa, and Sonoma. He also says the Republicans in all the localities which he visited are full of hope and determined to win the next contest, while the Democrats are dissatisfied, inharmonious, and fearful of losing control of the State. The Gorham-Bidwell battle, with change of names and party, is again being fought, hence things are mixed in the Democratic camp.
