Doings at Trinity City.

Affairs at this place as well as through the Valley of Taolumne, are daily increasing in interest. The following extract of a letter to a respectable house in this city, dated at Trinidad City, July 2, gives a lucid account of matters in that region :

"A party left here a few days since for the diggings A party lett here a few days since for the diggings, and when within five miles of the place were attacked by some Indians. A few days after a second party started for the same place, and on coming up to where the first party were attacked they found two of them severely wounded, a halt was made there and Major Smyth Clark went into town for assistance. On the following manning the Major headed a party of six was and other party of the west of the same party of the west of the same party of th morning the Major headed a party of six men, and at sun-down arrived at the camp, where a light breastwork had been thrown up under the superintendance of Major Rowe, late of the U.S. Army. The wounded men were properly cared for by Dr. Anderson, who accompanied the expedition. Mr. Thos. Ghion was pierced with seven arrows, and received a severe cut in the head from a hatchet. Mr. Ezra Hoit was wounded with four arrows. They were brought into town on mules and are now do-ing well. While the wounded men were being cared for a party of 50 men started off after the Indians; they killed two and took three prisoners, they burnt eleven houses or wigwams after taking all the curiosities out of them. We all returned to camp the same day, and an hour before sun-down the three Indians were fairly tried by a jury and condemned to be shot that night. The sen-tence was duly executed, and the bodies decently buried. We heard to day from "Humboldt" that the Indians at

that place had scalped a white man.

To-morrow an election will take place for Justice of the Peace; W. W. Hawks is the only candidate, his election, of course, is considered certain."
