LOYALTY AND LIBERTY IN MISSOURI .- Undismayed by the failure of Congress to make an appropriation to aid emancipation in Missouri, the dominant party in that State bave organized their forces to achieve the desired end by

other means. They have agreed to call a Convention to amend the Constitution, and in order to secure the control of that body have taken measures to perfect their organization throughout the State. The telegraph has informed us of the triumphs of this party at the Spring elections. The platform of the new organiza-tion which is destined to relieve Missouri from the incubus that has oppressed her energies reads as follows :

Whereas, For all purposes of public policy, and to

Whereas, For all purposes of public policy, and to unite conflicting opinions, a common organization is in-dispensable to public action; and Whereas. It is essential to the effective organization of the loyal sentiment of Missouri, that a common pol-icy should be inaugurated; therefore, the undersigned members of the General Assembly, on behalf of them-selves and the loyal people of the State, whom they represent, do hereby declare— First. That we are unalterably attached to the Con-stitution and Government of the United States and

situition and Government of the United States, and that we will protect and defend them under all circum-stances and against every danger. Second. That treason is the highest crime known to the law, and that rebels can of right have no voice in the control of the Government they have attempted to destroy.

Third. That in time of rebellion there can be but two

arties—patriots and traitors. Fourth. That we cordially sustain the President of he United States in all his efforts and all his meas-

the United States in all his efforts and all his meas-ures to put down the rebellion; that the proclamation of January 1, 1863, is one of a series of measures de-signed to cripple the enemy, to be enforced by the army, and must be sustained by all who would not weaken that army before the enemy; and that all efforts by political parties to impair the most vigorous measures for suppressiog the rebellion are but alding and supporting traitors in arms. Fifth. That we are now and were opposed to the formation of a Southern, Western, or any other repub-lic within the limits of the United States; that the ad-vocacy of any other republic save that of our fathers-one and indivisible—is treason. Sixth. That the institutions of a State should be har-monious, and in all charges the interests of the great mass should be considered.

The Rebels Repulsed in Two Attempts to Carry the Works.

NEWBERN.

the Works. [From the New York Times, March 20th.] On the 6th inst., General Herry Prince, with his divi-sion, Belger's and Riggs' battery, and a portion of the Third New York Cavairy, started on a reconnoissance to the south of Newbern. It was most successful in its results. The rebel force in Onsiow county was com-pletely broken up. Lieutenant Williams, of the Sixty-third North Carolina Cavalry, and about a dozen pris-oners, were captured, and the balance were dispersed, taking to the swamps to avoid being taken. The recon-

precedy or other application of the sixty-third North Carolina Cavairy, and about a dozen pris-oners, were captured, and the balance were dispersed, taking to the swamps to avoid being taken. The recom-noissance extended to Jacksonville, Onslow county, and information of a very valuable nature was ob-tained. The expedition returned to Newbern on the 11th inst, the enemy having failed to make a stand. Spinela's and Jourdan's brigades comprised the infantry force under General Prince. On the north side of the Trent river, the Twenty-fifth Massachusetts volunteers, with two companies of the Third New York cavairy, started on an expedition to proceed on the road as far as far as the Kloston and Trenton forks. They surprised a rebel encampment of two companies by night, and captured or dispersed the command, destroying their camp equipage, etc. On the 13th, the anniversary of the opening of the battle of Newbern, the enemy appeared in large force between the Trent and Neuse rivers, and drove our pickets in over Deep Gully. Colonel Lewis, command-ing the Third New York cavairy, was immediately thrown out with Belger's battery, to hold the enemy in check, which he successfully accomplished, when Gen-eral Palmer came up with a portion of his command, and the enemy fell back. On the morning of the 14th, a large force of the en-eray, with eighteen pieces of artillery, appeared in front of Fort Anderson, on the north side of the Neuse, and commenced its bombardment. Fort Anderson is an unfinished earthwork, without any cannon them mount-ed. The enemy sent in, by flag of truce, a summons to surrender, to which Colonel Anderson, commanding the garrison with the Ninety-second New York Volunteers, replied that it would be impossible for him to entertain the proposition, and immediately sent word to General Pe-tigrew, opened with their bytteries at short range with shot, shell and canister ; the meen protegted by the par-apet were untouched, but the tents in rear of the fart were completely riddled. apet were untouched, but the tents in rear of the for ere completely riddled.

were completely riddled. The cannonading, at daylight, aroused the whole town, the troops were under arms, and everything made ready for a general attack on the city. General Foster sent word to the garrison to hold out till the last moment, and never to surrender. The gunboats under command of Commodore Murray were soon in position, and the scene became one of in-tense excitement; everything contered on the little band in the fort. The gunboats soon sent their terrible missiles, and told upon the enemy with good effect— one shell from the Hunchback killing two men and wounding thirteen,

missiles, and told upon the enemy with good effect— one shell from the Hunchback killing two men and wounding thirteen, The enemy's fire slackened and then entirely ceased; another fag of truee, with a summons to surrender, giving Colonel Anderson seven minutes to answer in before an assault. Colonel Anderson replied that he did not want seven seconds, and when they fired it suited his convenience, as well as the assault. During this time General Prince had been placing in position some 20-pound howitzers, belonging to Ransom's bat-tery, and they opened upon the enemy in a lively man-ner, and after three hours sharp work the enemy fell back repulsed in their efforts to capture Colonel Anderson and his command During the day the fort was reinforced by the Eighty-fifth New York. General Foster was present where the danger was most imminent, and directed in person much of the artillery fire from the Newbern side of the Neuse river. The casualities were very slight on our side—one man killed and two wounded. The intentions of the enemy were not fully ascertained when our informant left, on Sunday at two o'clock. General Prince, with his di-vision, was en route to the front, and would give the enemy battle, if they should make a stand. During the cannonading the banks of the Neuse were lined with men, women and children, as well as the housetops. Some of these succeeded in making their escape while on their way to this place In the attack one of Captain Flynn's men, named Timothy Lynch, who enlisted in Oregon, was shot through the heart with an arrow. Orderly Sergeant Thoman received an arrow through his cap box, lodging in his belt. But little provision was found in the ranches, though they were well supplied with bows and arrows, knives, blankets, trinkets and other article

a double-barreled rifle. This was the same band of Indians that attacked a detachment of Company C, Captain O'Brien, last Spring. Steve Fleming, who was then the guide, led Flynn's party to the ranches.
