CONFLICT-OF-INTEREST CODE

The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000, et seq.) requires

state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict-of-interest codes.

The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 California Code of

Regulations Section 18730) that contains the terms of a standard conflict-of-interest code,

which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and

hearing, the standard code may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to

conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California

Code of Regulations Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair

Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and

the attached Appendices, designating positions and establishing disclosure categories,

shall constitute the conflict-of-interest code of the Native American Heritage

Commission (Commission).

Individuals holding designated positions shall file their statements of economic

interests with the Commission, which will make the statements available for public

inspection and reproduction. (Gov. Code Sec. 81008.) Upon receipt of the statements of

the Commission Members and the Executive Director, the Commission shall make and

retain copies and forward the originals to the Fair Political Practices Commission. All

other statements will be retained by the Commission.

Consultants/New Positions*

* Consultants and new positions shall be included in the list of designated positions and shall disclose pursuant to the broadest disclosure category in the code, subject to the following limitation:

The Executive Secretary may determine in writing that a particular consultant or new position, although a "designated position," is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and thus is not required to fully comply with the disclosure requirements in this section. Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant's or new position's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The Executive Secretary's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict-of-interest code. (Gov. Code § 81008.)

Appendix B Disclosure Category 1

Interest in real property in the State of California, and investments and business positions in business entities, and all sources of income (including receipt of loans, gifts, and travel payments) – from sources

- which engage in the acquisition, disposal or development of real property such sources include developers and landowners of commercial or residential property.
- provide leased facilities, goods, equipment, vehicles, machinery or services, including training or consulting services, or the type utilized by the Commission.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO AMEND THE CONFLICT-OF-INTEREST CODE OF THE NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE COMMISSION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Native American Heritage Commission, pursuant to the authority vested in it by section 87306 of the Government Code, proposes amendments to its Conflict-of-Interest Code. The purpose of these amendments is to implement the requirements of sections 87300 through 87302, and section 87306 of the Government Code.

The Native American Heritage Commission proposes to amend its Conflict-of-Interest Code to include employee positions that involve the making or participation in the making of decisions that may foreseeably have a material effect on any financial interest, as set forth in subdivision (a) of section 87302 of the Government Code.

This amendment includes position(s) previously not included and makes other technical changes to reflect the current organizational structure of the Department. Copies of the amended code are available and may be requested from the Contact Person set forth below.

Any interested person may submit written statements, arguments, or comments relating to the proposed amendments by submitting them in writing no later than April 13, 2015, or at the conclusion of the public hearing, if requested, whichever comes later, to the Contact Person set forth below.

At this time, no public hearing has been scheduled concerning the proposed amendments. If any interested person or the person's representative requests a public hearing, he or she must do so no later than March 30, 2015, by contacting the Contact Person set forth below.

The Native American Heritage Commission has prepared a written

explanation of the reasons for the proposed amendments and has available the information on which the amendments are based. Copies of the proposed amendments, the written explanation of the reasons, and the information on which the amendments are based may be obtained by contacting the Contact Person set forth below.

The Native American Heritage Commission has determined that the proposed amendments:

- 1. Impose no mandate on local agencies or school districts.
- 2. Impose no costs or savings on any state agency.
- 3. Impose no costs on any local agency or school district that are required to be reimbursed under Part 7 (commencing with Section 17500) of Division 4 of Title 2 of the Government Code.
- 4. Will not result in any nondiscretionary costs or savings to local agencies.
- 5. Will not result in any costs or savings in federal funding to the state.
- 6. Will not have any potential cost impact on private persons, businesses or small businesses.

In making these proposed amendments, the Native American Heritage Commission must determine that no alternative considered by the agency would be more effective in carrying out the purpose for which the amendments are proposed or would be as effective and less burdensome to affected persons than the proposed amendments. INITIAL STATEMENT OF REASONS IN SUPPORT OF PROPOSE AMENDMENT TO CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

The Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) filled its General Counsel position (Attorney III) in December of 2013. The NAHC's current Conflict of Interest Code did not include the General Counsel position as a designated position for which a Statement of Economic Disclosure (Form 700) should be filed. It also erroneously included the Environmental Scientist position as a designated position. As part of the biennial review of the NAHC's Conflict of Interest Code, it was determined that the NAHC's Conflict of Interest Code needed to be amended to include the General Counsel as a designated position and to exclude the Environmental Scientist position from being a designated position.
