Unit Title: Repatriation Overview

Outline of Training:

This unit draws on both Federal and California laws to provide the background and policy behind collections and repatriation of Human Remains and Cultural Items. The unit will focus on the 2020 UC System State Audit, key changes to CalNAGPRA from AB 275, repatriation requirements for the UC System, and the role of the NAHC will be reviewed and discussed.

Part 2: Barriers to Repatriation

Part 3: Major Changes in CalNAGPRA

Part 4: NAHC Duties
