Summary of Experience

Cheryl is an enrolled member of the Pauma Band of Luiseño Indians and serves as the Cultural Resources Department Manager and Tribal Historic Preservation Officer for the Rincon Band of Luiseño Indians (Rincon) and spearheads Rincon's efforts to develop and operate tribal cultural resources protection and preservation programs. This includes overseeing language revitalization programs, traditional workshops, facilitating NAGPRA consultation, and consultations on projects on and off-reservation under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act and California Environmental Quality Act.

Beginning in 2009, Cheryl's academic work and student research has included a focus on American Indian Law including cultural resources preservation and tribal rights under the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA). Working for various tribal and non-tribal museums has provided Cheryl with an insight and understanding of many institutional challenges as well as barriers often encountered by tribes throughout the repatriation consultation process.

Through consultation with federal, state and local agencies, as well as collaborative work with other Tribes, Cheryl is aware of the required sensitivity during any efforts to reunite ancestral remains and cultural heritage materials with their communities.

Cheryl holds a Bachelor's degree in United States History with a minor in Native American Studies from the University of California, Riverside, and a Master's Degree in Museum Studies from the Johns Hopkins University.

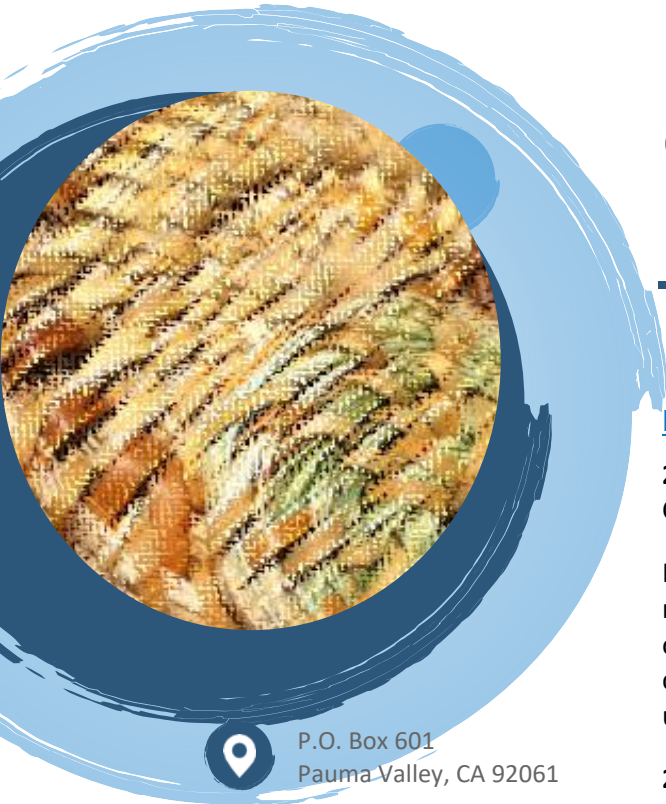
