1 **RECITALS**

2 WHEREAS under the April 4, 2025, Stipulated Judgment, Order and Peremptory Writ,
3 the recitals and terms of which are incorporated herein by reference as though fully set out, the
4 Native American Heritage Commission's (Commission) October 20, 2023, decision declaring the
5 real property owned by Petitioner and Plaintiff, City of Corona to be a Native American
6 sanctified cemetery, is to be overturned, rescinded, withdrawn and set aside by April 25, 2025,
7 and a return on the peremptory writ to be filed by April 29, 2025;

8 WHEREAS the Commission's April 25, 2025, meeting was canceled due to the lack of a
9 quorum;

10 WHEREAS the next Commission meeting is now scheduled for May 9, 2025;

11 WHEREAS this is the first request to extend the deadline for the return on the peremptory
12 writ and is not being done to needlessly delay the management of this case; and

13 WHEREAS the parties have met and conferred and have agreed that under the
14 circumstances an extension of time is appropriate.

15 **STIPULATION**

16 NOW, THEREFORE, it is STIPULATED AND AGREED, by and between the parties
17 through the undersigned counsel as follows:

18 1. The parties agree and on that basis request that the time for the Commission to file
19 a return on the peremptory writ be extended up to and including May 13, 2025, or to another date
20 the court deems appropriate.




